
# **INEZ DEMONET AWARD**

NICHOLAS KILNER-PONTONE, winner of the 2024 Inez Demonet Award. He attended a magnet high school for visual arts in Baltimore County, MD where he realized he wanted to go to art school and learn to be an illustrator. He graduated with honors from Pratt Institute in Brooklyn NY in 2020 with a BFA in Illustration. He freelanced as an illustrator while cultivating an interest in biology, working in landscaping and gardening. The pandemic taught him the importance of effective scientific communication; during this time, he discovered medical illustration. He enrolled at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County, to build upon a lifelong interest in the sciences. In 2022 he enrolled in the Medical and Biological Illustration Program, Johns Hopkins University. While a student he was

awarded the Joseph M. Dieter Jr. Scholarship for Creative Design Excellence, a merit award from the AMI 2023 student salon, as well as a 2024 Vesalius Trust research grant.

He is currently growing his career as a medical illustrator, and one day hopes to have his own garden.



#### Do you have the Russell Drake Sketch Book?

The VT office has copies of Russell Drake's sketchbook, containing 128 pages showing his techniques in sketching, inking and carbon dust techniques. Russell Drake trained directly under Max Brödel at Johns Hopkins and was a renowned medical illustrator at the Mayo Clinic from 1917 – 1961. The book also comes complete with 6 separate frameable sheet drawings from the author.

#### VESALIUS TRUST COLLECTION



The Association of Medical Illustrators established the Vesalius Trust as a non-profit public foundation in 1988 with a mission to provide funding to support education and research in visual communication for health sciences. In 2010,

the Vesalius Trust, spearheaded by Marcia Hartsock, CMI, collaborated with the Lloyd Library making the Lloyd the repository for the Trust's collection of original artwork of professional medical illustrators. It is the goal of the Lloyd Library to care for, preserve and provide access to this collection for education and research.

# Art & Anatomy Tour of Southern Italy 2024

# Art & Anatomy Tour of Spain 2025

The tour will run from October 7 to 17, 2025. Beginning in Madrid's Plaza Mayor historic district, you will visit the Thyssen-Bornemisza and Reina Sofía museums that feature Renaissance to modern artworks from Caravaggio, Dürer, to Dalí, Hopper and Picasso. Special tours of the Puerta Museum of Anatomy and attendance to the medical conference at the University of Madrid's Faculty of Medicine are scheduled. Also during the 6 days in



Madrid, are visits to San Fernando Academy of Fine Arts to see the Goya collections and frescoes as well as a look at the National Anthropology Museum. Enjoy a trip to Toledo and the El Greco Museum. Before leaving Madrid, you will be treated to a special pre-opening tour of the Prado Museum without the crowds to experience works of Goya, Velázquez, Rubens, El Greco, and Hieronymus Bosch, oh my! What a garden of Earthly Delights!

Then off to Barcelona to experience Gaudi's Park Güell and the Basílica de la Sagrada Familia. Walk through the Picasso Museum and the Anatomical Theater of Barcelona. The tour finishes with an excursion to Montjüic for its architecture and National Museum of Catalan Art. Sign up by February 1<sup>st</sup>.
